

Gulfport Airman Author New Book

A1-C Willis Jefferson, 25, Fort Fisher Air Station, N. C., son of Mr. and Mrs. David Jefferson, 4703 Alabama Ave., Gulfport, will have a book published Sept. 1 by Vanguard Press of New York City. The volume is entitled Scientific Articles.

His scientific research deals with some 15 or 16 laws, the first on law of spinning spheres, which he formulated. Some are derived from Newton and Einstein, and some refute Newton, according to an article appearing in the Fort Fisher News.

His research and thoughts in this area started in 1964. The actual writing of the book took about a year and a half, according to Jefferson. The work was completed last summer, but Jefferson said it took him a year to find a publisher.

Dr. L. W. Lau, professor of physics at the University of North Carolina at Wilmington, said of Jefferson's book, "The thought is coherent within itself and it is very interesting. Mr. Jefferson certainly does not subscribe to accepted theories and his theories deserve discussion and explanation."

Airman Jefferson is a graduate of Thirty-Third Avenue High School in Gulfport, attended Tugaloo College for one year and studied for two years at Milwaukee Institute of Technology. After entering the Air Force he was stationed at Keesler Air Force Base for one year.

Jefferson was named June's

Airman of the Month for the 701st Radar Squadron at Fort Fisher where he has been stationed since January 1969.

Aside from his research and duties involving radar maintenance, he is a music lover and has collected some 1,130 45 rpm records running the gamut from classical to rhythm and blues.

Jefferson stated in the interview with the Air Force reporter, "God is everywhere—on all levels of time and space. Seven days could be 700 billion years, or more in human time. Thus, the most logical explanation of the Creation is found in Gen. 11:1." In a chart included in his book, Jefferson showed how time can vary from one level of mass in space to another by billions of years.
